

Statement for Parents Pupil Premium Dallington Church Of England Primary school 2015-16

Dallington Church of England Primary School receives a Pupil Premium Grant for every child who is entitled to receive Free School Meals or who has been entitled over the last five years. This grant also applies to Looked After Children.

We are now required to publish online information on how we have used this premium to benefit the children.

Pupil Premium Grant April 2015- 16

Dallington's funding for April 2015 – March 2016 was £13780

We used this fund to:

- To provide staff training across the school, to support specific children.
- To enable all families to access Breakfast club
- To offer financial assistance to pay for clubs, trips and residential.
- To provide extra counselling support through Fegans.
- To support the development of outside learning with a trained Forest School's teacher.
- Resources such as Clever Touch Boards.
- To give additional emotional support through the Thrive Programme and access to Fegans counselling.
- To provide Speech and Language assessment and therapy.

All matters regarding the grant are treated with discretion and in confidence.

Impact of support on those Pupil's receiving Pupil Premium funds.

- 100% of pupils receiving Pupil Premium were fully included in all trips including residential offered by the school.
- 2 children receiving Pupil Premium benefitted from the Thrive Programme giving emotional support .
- 2 pupils benefitted from a place at breakfast club
- 9 pupils have so far taken part Forest schools experience.
- All pupils receiving Pupil Premium Grant are working at age appropriate levels.
