Supporting children to feel connected with school and emotionally equipped to be able to engage with learning in school or remotely is a priority at this time of change and uncertainty; by working closely with the child and family, we aim to provide a routine of provision in school or remotely, which supports a child's view of themselves as a learner, as a friend and as a valued member of the school community.

Since the introduction of *Google Classroom* in October 2020, we have seen improved pupil engagement, interaction opportunities between peers, increased parent engagement and during a period of pandemic *lockdown*, opportunities for spontaneous communication about learning and life. For families who do not engage with *Google Classroom* we look at alternative ways to support the child's continued learning.

To enable staff to maintain a connection with the child and to structure learning tasks, there is regular communication with parents/carers including daily on *Google Classroom* and staff aim to speak by phone to a family member at least once every 2 weeks.

For children with school based plans, provision and learning will be made different by the teacher, supported in school or remotely. Interventions to close learning gaps will continue for children in school.

Children following programmes advised by outside agencies e.g. Speech & Language, will be supported at home through regular home/school contact and during the school day child is attending school.

Annual reviews will go ahead remotely for any child with an Education Healthcare plan.
