Science week

This week we have been celebrating science. It started with a bang on Monday when we welcomed Fizz, Pop Science to Dallington School. It was a brilliant start with KS2 acting like detectives and solving a crime using their scietifc knowledge. They used finger prints, chromotography, black lights, chemical reactions and a whole lot of enthusiasm to solve the mystery. KS1 looked at chemical reactions, they learnt about acids, alkalines and the PH scale. They too became detectives and tested different liquids to find out which one was water. Using their knowledge of chemical reactions they made slime! It was an amazing start to the week.
