We had Claire, from the library service, come in and launch the Summer reading challenge. As I said_I can bore you all with the **importance** of reading and how children being introduced to reading and high level vocabulary is essential if they are going to succeed – not just at Primary school but at secondary school as well. The Summer reading challenge is such a brilliant way to encourage children to read but also introduce them to their local library.

This year's theme is Wild World Heroes, a celebration of nature and action in the enviornment- it is supprted by the WWF UK. The initiative will run from 10th July until September 11th. The Challenge is to read any six books borrowed from the library or downloaded from the eBook library. When Claire came in I was really impressed with how the library have embraced the daily hectic life – they have e-books, dyslexia friendly books – picture books, books to share, audio books, books for every age, ability and taste! For children under 4 they have the Pre-school Challenge, where you can collect stickers for each book shared and a special medal sticker at the end.

Children will be able to collect a prize for each of the six books they have read.

When they finish the Challenge they will get a certificate which they can receive in school or at the library. The Challenge is for all children, whatever their reading ability. With the range of 'resources' they are offering there really is no excuse not to get your child signed up! Good luck!



Brightling activity week


