#### Summer reading challenge

I can bore you all with the importance of reading and how children being introduced to reading and high level vocabulary is essential if they are going to succeed – not just at Primary school but at secondary school as well. The Summer reading challenge is such a brilliant way to encourage children to read but also introduce them to their local library. This year's theme is Wild World Heroes, a celebration of nature and action in the enviornment- it is supprted by the WWF UK. The Reading Agency, who produce this national scheme, have also created video trailers with general information about Wild World Heroes,

#### <u>Video Trailer</u>

The initiative will run from 10<sup>th</sup> July until September 11<sup>th</sup>. The Challenge is to read any six books borrowed from the library or downloaded from the eBook library. For children under 4 they have the Pre-school Challenge, where you can collect stickers for each book shared and a special medal sticker at the end. Children signing up for the Challenge get a character sticker and a Reader Record. Children will be able to collect a prize for each of the six books they have read. When they finish the Challenge they will get a certificate which they can receive in school or at the library. The Challenge is for all children, whatever their reading ability. Children who are not reading independently can share their books with a family member or friend, or they might prefer to listen to audio books. Good luck!
