<u>Literacy</u>



In literacy we will be following Jane Considine's Write Stuff lessons helping to develop children's story writing. The children will be writing a story based around the book The Whale by Vita Murrow. The sessions will be focused on building up the story in plot pieces focusing on the use of descriptive language and sentence structure. In the second term we will move onto non-fiction writing.

Mathematics

In mathematics we will be focusing on angles before moving onto multiplication. Learning our timetables will also be an important focus with daily activities.

<u>Science</u>

Our science this term we are studying living things and habitats. We will be looking at different habitats, classifying creatures and using our observational skills to draw and sketch insects.



History/Geography



This term, geography is our main focus. We will be focussing on identifying the position and significance of latitude, longitude, Equator, Northern Hemisphere, Southern Hemisphere, the Tropics of Cancer and Capricorn, Arctic and Antarctic Circle, the Prime/ Greenwich Meridian and time zones (including day and night).

<u>PSHE</u>

This term in PSHE the children will be looking at beliefs. We will focus on gender and stereotypes. In term 4, we will look at my rights and responsibilities and asking for help.

<u>PE</u>

We will be moving onto gymnastics this term.



<u>RE</u>

Within RE, we will be looking at Moses and Exodus. Learning why Moses is important to Jews and Christians. Later we will be learning why Christians call the day that Jesus died Good Friday.

Computing

In ICT the children will start by focussing on internet safety before moving onto branching databases. These help us to sort information.



ART/DT

Linked to our topic Blue Planet. Later in the term the children will be making lighthouses, using lights and electrical systems.
