# Reading Challenge

I am so excited to share this with you! Every year the library service offers the Summer reading challenge, it is a wonderful opportunity for the children to access the library, a range of books and continue their exploration of books outside of school. Every WEEK we talk about the importance of reading and how spending 5-10 minutes reading to your child can have a massive impact on their vocabulary, understanding and opportunities in life.

Normally, we have 12 to 13 children who complete the reading challenge and I was always proud of this, but I have spoken to the library service, who have informed me that this year we had 49 children start the challenge and 40 who completed it! That is incredible! Well done, everyone!

If your child is one of the 9 who didn't finish the challenge, remember we said we would extend the deadline until October half term to allow those older children who are reading larger books the opportunity to finish them.

#### Book Fair


