## Chicks

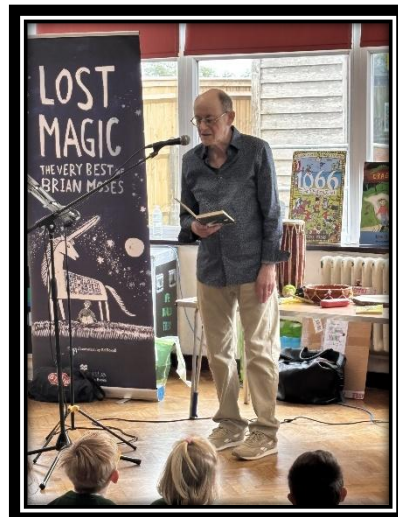

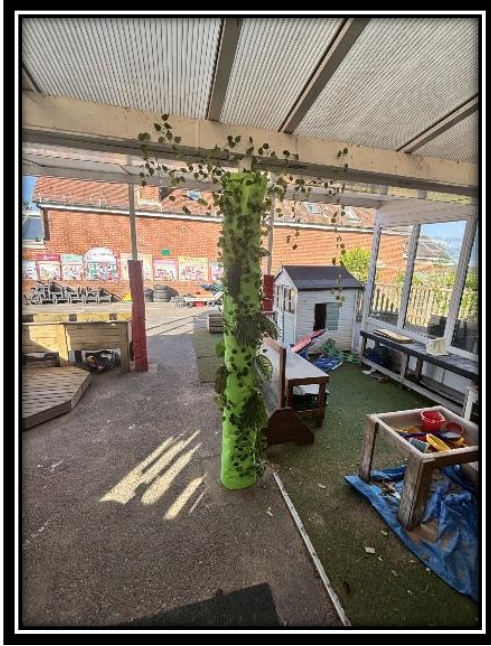
Its update time – Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> - We now have 6! It has caused so much excitement across the school – Dallington class has been visited by staff, children and parents!
